



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ABC's of AAC

What is AAC?

AAC stands for Augmentative and Alternative Communication. It includes all the ways someone can communicate besides talking. Some people use AAC all the time, while others use it only when they need extra support. The goal of AAC is to help everyone share their thoughts, needs, feelings, and ideas.



Types of AAC:

Unaided AAC

- Gestures (pointing, waving, shrugging)
- Facial expressions (smiling, frowning)
- Sign language or finger spelling
- Body language

Aided AAC

- **Low-tech tools** (do not require batteries):
- **High-tech tools** (use technology)
